

## **CAMP DRESS CODE**

At Rocky Mountain Honors Camp we want everything we do to glorify the Lord, and that includes the way we dress (1 Cor. 10:31). **Modesty and appropriateness** in a distraction-free environment is the goal for everyone's week at camp!

Please take the time to review our Dress Code so that you will choose clothes that will be right for camp. Here's the deal: if you choose to wear outfits that are too tight, too loose, or too short you will be asked to change. Ugh! The following policies need to be followed by campers, counselors, and staff alike. Though your clothing choices may be comfortable for you, they may make others uncomfortable; therefore, **please take the time to read this!** 

- Shirts and shoes or sandals must be always worn when outdoors or in a public setting.
- Athletic (closed toe) shoes must be worn for all activities.
- Flannel pants/pajama pants are only acceptable for bedtime/cabin wearing.
- No tank tops, halter tops, low necklines, sleeveless tops, and narrow or string-type straps.
- Skirts and dresses must be knee-length or longer unless leggings are worn under, and even then skirts or dresses must be mid-thigh or longer.
- Shorts may be mid-thigh length or longer even if worn with leggings (see picture).



- All clothing must be loose fitting (no yoga/spandex/tight clothing).
- No skin may show between pants and shirt (raise your arms to make sure). Low rise/sagging
  pants or shorts are not allowed. Ripped pants have the same mid-thigh rule (no upper thigh
  holes).
- Do not wear clothing that reveals your underwear (that's a no-brainer).
- Offensive clothing with inappropriate language, or something not honoring to God is not allowed.
- Body piercing jewelry (other than earrings for females) are not allowed please use a clear spacer for any body piercings other than earrings – you will be asked to remove piercings outside of bedtime, if visible.
- Tattoos We do not promote for or against tattoos but expect tattoos to be covered with clothing or a wrap/bandage.

If there is a question about an article of clothing, your counselor or a staff member will speak to you about it privately asking you to change. In all cases, the word of the Camp Director will be final.
